# House Bill 123 Effective 3/24/2021



- Tip Line Now in effect
- Behavioral Assessment Teams by March 24, 2023
- Suicide Prevention Training by March 24, 2023

# Tip Line



- Must be in place for the 2021-2022 school year
- Operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week
- Forward reported information to and coordinate with the appropriate school threat assessment teams and law enforcement and public safety agencies required under the school's emergency management plan developed under Ohio Revised Code Section 5502.262
- Be promoted in each district school to inform students about the reporting program and its reporting methods
- Comply Ohio Revised Code Sections 149.433 and 3319.321 and the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," 20 U.S.C. 1232g.

# Tip Line



## Data Submission Requirements:

- Requires each anonymous reporting program provider annually to submit to the Departments of Education and Public Safety the number of reports made through the program and the method by which they were received.
- More information on how to submit this data will be released in Spring 2022.

The Ohio School Threat Assessment Training course is being offered as a partnership by the Department of Public Safety, Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Attorney General's Office and meets the requirements outlined in HB 123. It is available on the Ohio Attorney General's Training Portal and after completing the entire course which includes 10 modules there will be a certificate that can be printed for your school's administration.

Please follow the steps below to create an account and enroll in the course:

ORC 5502.263 requires: "(B) Not later than two years after the effective date of this section, the department of public safety, in consultation with the department of education and the attorney general, shall develop a model threat assessment plan that may be used in a building's emergency management plan developed under section 5502.262 of the Revised Code. The model plan shall do at least the following:



- (1) Identify the types of threatening behavior that may represent a physical threat to a school community.
- (2) Identify individuals to whom threatening behavior should be reported and steps to be taken by those individuals.
- (3) Establish threat assessment guidelines including identification, evaluation of seriousness of threat or danger, intervention to reduce potential violence, and follow-up to assess intervention results.
- (4) Establish guidelines for coordinating with local law enforcement agencies and reports collected through the district's chosen anonymous reporting program under section 3313.6610 of the Revised Code and identify a point of contact within each agency.
- (5) Conform with all other specifications in a school's emergency management plan developed under section 5502.262 of the Revised Code."



When the team's building administrator submits the building's emergency management plan to the Director of Public Safety.

A protocol for the threat assessment team also must be included in the building's emergency management plan.

### THREAT REPORT

A threat is an expression of intent to harm someone that may be spoken, written, gestured, or communicated in some other form, such as via text message or email. Threats may be explicit or implied, directed at the intended target or communicated to a third party. Behavior that suggests a threat such as weapon carrying, fighting, or menacing actions should be investigated to determine whether a threat is present.

The process is designed for assessment of threats to harm others and is not intended for individuals who have only threatened to harm themselves.

Only a small percentage of cases require both threat assessment and suicide assessment, and in those cases, the team should supplement this form with their choice of a standard suicide assessment protocol.

# Suicide awareness and prevention; social inclusion training and instruction.

Requires each school district, beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, to provide annual student instruction in:

- 1. Suicide awareness and prevention
- 2. Safety training and violence prevention
- 3. Social inclusion



## Suicide Prevention – March 2023

- Suicide Awareness & Prevention Education
- Provided to students and staff
- Identification of signs (depression/suicide/self harm)
- Identification of Mental Health Services
- How to report



## Suicide Prevention

- Grades 6 -12
- One Hour of Classroom Training (exemptions parent request)
- May use student assemblies, digital learning and homework.



## Suicide Prevention

- ODE in consultation with Mental Health & Addition Services shall post a list of approved training programs
- One option is free or of no cost to schools



## Suicide awareness and prevention; social inclusion training and instruction

- Requires the Department of Education, in consultation with the Departments of Public Safety and Mental Health and Addiction Services, to maintain a list of approved training programs for instruction in suicide awareness and prevention and violence prevention.
- Requires the Department of Education, in consultation with the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services, to maintain a list of approved training programs for instruction in social inclusion.
- Specifies that the staff training programs on youth suicide awareness and prevention developed by the Department satisfy the biennial professional development requirements on that subject required by continuing law.
- Requires each school district, beginning in the 2023-2024 school year, to provide annual student instruction in (1) suicide awareness and prevention, (2) safety training and violence prevention, and (3) social inclusion.



## **Staff Training**

The act specifies that the staff training programs on youth suicide awareness and prevention developed by the Department of Education satisfy the biennial professional development requirements on that subject required by continuing law.

Under that law, nurses, teachers, counselors, school psychologists, administrators, and any other appropriate personnel employed by a school district, educational service center, community school, or STEM school must complete in-service training in suicide awareness and prevention once every two years.

This provision applies to all **public schools**.



### **Student Instruction**

The act requires each school district as part of its health curriculum, beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, to use an approved training program to provide instruction for grades 6-12

At least one hour, or one standard class period, per school year in each of the following:

- 1. Suicide awareness and prevention
- 2. Safety training and violence prevention
- 3. Evidence-based social inclusion instruction. In each case, upon written request of the student's parent or guardian, a student must be excused from the instruction.
- 4. Schools may use student assemblies, digital learning, and homework to satisfy these instruction requirements.

This provision applies only to school districts and does not apply to other public schools.
